SUMMARY OF SECRETARY'S REPORT TO THE DSMA COMMITTEE COVERING ACTIVITIES DURING THE PERIOD 17 APR-18 OCT 24

During the last 6-month period, the DSMA secretariat received 54 requests for DSMA Notice advice, a decrease over the previous period (73). The Secretariat issued one supplementary DSMA notice in connection with potential UK evacuation operations in Lebanon. Twenty-four requests were initiated by members of the UK media, 22 by Government officials and 8 by members of the public.
